APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

1. Before applying for and/or obtaining a Commercial Burn Permit from the City of Dickinson, applicant must have registered with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality Office of Permitting, Remediation, and Registration in Austin using Form PI-7. (A copy of the Commissions Written Site Approval and a copy of the Form PI -7, must be attached to this application)
2. Trench burning must be in accordance with the City of Dickinson Code of Ordinances and written permission from the Executive Director of the TCEQ. If there is a conflict in regulations, the most restrictive shall apply. Compliance with TCEQ rules does not indicate automatic approval for a Commercial Burn Permit from the City of Dickinson's Fire Marshal Office.
3. A site plan of the proposed "Commercial Burn" (trench burning) site containing the address of the site, length, width, and depth of the property, location of the trench on the property, distance to building exposures, and length, width, and depth of the trench shall be submitted with this application.
4. Adherence to the City of Dickinson Commercial Burning Regulations shall be followed at all times.
5. No Commercial Burning may begin until an on-site inspection of the trench burner has been performed and this application has been approved by the Fire Marshal or his designee.

I the undersigned applicant hereby request a Commercial Burn Permit from the City of Dickinson. By signing below I acknowledge receipt of the City of Dickinson Commercial Burning Regulations and agree to abide by them. This permit in no way grants permission to conduct outdoor burning in any way other than described and does not eliminate requirements of other agencies including Galveston County and the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.

Failure to comply with regulations may result in the issuance of citations.
